II TIMOTHY 3: 6-9

NEW LIVING TRANSLATION (NLT)

6 They are the kind who work their way into people's homes and win the confidence of ^[a]vulnerable women who are burdened with the guilt of sin and controlled by various desires. **7** (Such women are forever following new teachings, but they are never able to understand the truth.) **8** These teachers oppose the truth just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses. They have depraved minds and a counterfeit faith. **9** But they won't get away with this for long. Someday everyone will recognize what fools they are, just as with Jannes and Jambres.

DAY 3 REFLECTION QUESTIONS FOR VERSES 6-9

1. Through a modern lens, vs. 6 can be interpreted as sexist. However, at its root, it is a warning against false teachers with selfish motives. How are people (women or men) more susceptible to deception when they're already "led astray" (vs. 6)?
2. There are many movements today that focus on non-essential theological issues that have no resolution. Can you see how one can be "always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth" (vs. 7)?
3. Verse 8 refers to an Old Testament story about two men who opposed Moses. What does this verse show us about the potential to be corrupted in our minds and "disqualified regarding the faith" (vs. 8)? What will be the result (vs. 9)?
