COLOSSIANS 4: 14-18

NEW LIVING TRANSLATION (NLT)

14 Luke, the beloved doctor, sends his greetings, and so does Demas. **15** Please give my greetings to our brothers and sisters at Laodicea, and to Nympha and the church that meets in her house.

16 After you have read this letter, pass it on to the church at Laodicea so they can read it, too. And you should read the letter I wrote to them.

17 And say to Archippus, "Be sure to carry out the ministry the Lord gave you."

18 HERE IS MY GREETING IN MY OWN HANDWRITING—PAUL.

Remember my chains.

May God's grace be with you.

DAY 6 REFLECTION QUESTIONS FOR VERSES 14-18

1. If Luke was a doctor (vs. 14), what does that tell us about the diversity of the Christ followers in the early church? Should we see diversity today?
2. From verse 16, what can we conclude about the value of Paul's letters to all the churches of the day (vs. 16)?
3. What did Paul ask the Colossians to remember in vs. 18? What do you think "remember my chains" means? How can we still remember those in chains today?
